

Memorial Garden

Memorial Garden

The Trustees are moving forward with a Memorial Garden that will contain a communal space for the final resting place of ashes of loved ones. Below is a custom design that has been submitted to the Trustees which they have viewed and are considering at recommendation of the Trustees ad hoc committee overseeing the Memorial The "communal Garden. urn" design is intended to be a significant beginning of the Memorial Garden in which cremains would be secure inside a hand-hewn rock design that would be locked and sealed, thereby avoiding the expense of a fence and keeping the garden area on the Martin Street side of the

This is a revised design for a communal urn. Though similar in form to the first design, there are some significant changes to the piece.

The base has been removed, so that the sides continue down into the ground without any change to the

The cap is a single piece of stone, that is flat and allows for a sculptural piece- a cross created by a member of the congregation.

Not shown in these sketches: the concrete footing that supports the piece will be a donut- open in the middle. This allows for the ashes to make contact with the Earth.

Midway up the main body of the urn there is a single piece of stone that is inscribed with a quote or verse that speaks to the cycle of life and the passage from one place into the next. I consulted with the engravers I like to work with; they expect that we would be able to fit about 97 letters on the perimeter of that stone. That should serve as a general guide to choosing a phrase or quote. I would be inclined to err on the lower side of that number as you search for a suitable

5 Minute Yoga

We'll practice a few exercises for the eyes.

- Sit tall in your chair, with your feet on the floor, back straight, shoulders down and away from your ears.
- Look directly in front of you, and without moving your head, look to the upper right corner of the room. Take 3 breaths here, then take your gaze
- Next, take your gaze to the upper left corner of the room. Take 3 breaths before taking your gaze back to
- Shut your eyes and rest them for a few seconds.
- Next, open your eyes and look forward. Then take the gaze to the lower right corner of the room and take 3 breaths. Then take your gaze back to center, then gaze to the lower left corner of the room. Take 3 breaths before returning your gaze to center.
- Shut your eyes and rest them for a few seconds.
- Next, raise your hand in front of your nose, about a foot away. Keep your eyes on your hand as you bring the hand closer to your face, then take the hand away from the face. Repeat this action a couple more times, and remember to breathe normally.
- Shut your eyes and rest them for a few seconds.
- Next, keeping your face still, imagine a clock face, and slowly take your gaze to each hour around that clock face. Pause as the 12 hour, and then go in the opposite direction.
- Shut your eyes and rest them for a few seconds. Smile and praise God for all His blessings in your life. Pastoral Care Team



Book Group

We will finish reading Kate Bowler's Everything Happens for a Reason: And Other Lies I've Loved on Mar. 6.

Beginning Mar. 13, we'll begin Phillip Yancey's What's So Amazing About Grace? Award-winning author Philip Yancey explores grace at street level. If grace is God's love for the undeserving, he asks, then what does it look like in action? And AMAZIN if Christians are its sole dispensers, then how are we doing at lavishing grace on a



world that knows far more of cruelty and unforgiveness than it does of mercy?

Yancey sets grace in the midst of life's stark images, tests its mettle against horrific "ungrace." Can grace survive in the midst of such atrocities as the Nazi holocaust? Can it triumph over the brutality of the Ku Klux Klan? Should any grace at all be shown to the likes of Jeffrey Dahmer, who killed and cannibalized seventeen young men?

Grace does not excuse sin, says Yancey, but it treasures the sinner. True grace is shocking, scandalous. It shakes our conventions with its insistence on getting close to sinners and touching them with mercy and hope. It forgives the unfaithful spouse, the racist, the child abuser. It loves today's AIDS-ridden addict as much as the tax collector of Jesus' day. This is a wonderful, accessible book. Consider joining us on Wednesdays at IIAM in the Church Library. Did you know that when you sign the Registration & Attendance pad, it helps us collect important data for our church statistics, including the average worship attendance? FYI - having just completed our 2018 statistics, our average worship attendance (often referred to as AWA) was 119 and our average Sunday School attendance was 50. Other 2018 "fun fact stats": baptisms, 14 new members received, 10 deaths, 409 professing members on our rolls (218 women, 191 men). 35 baptized (formerly called "preparatory" members still to become professing), 40 constituents ("friends" of TUMC who attend regularly but have not made official membership). 


Christian Formation on Sundays

Trinity has a lively program for adults on Sunday mornings:

The Koinonia Class is carefully working their way through scripture. In March, they'll be studying the Book of Ephesians with a focus on the early church and how it applies today.

The Mary Mann Class follows the Cokebury's Adult Bible Study Series. This spring series presents readings following theme the "Discipleship and Mission." The Ministry of Generosity

For 2018, spending exceeded revenue by around \$10,000, which is the smallest deficit in the past 5 years, so we are moving in a positive direction. Finance Chair Cathi Durham expressed thanks to the church staff for their hard work in keeping expenditures down.

We still need around \$17,000 to pay off the funds borrowed from the J. D. Howell fund for the Capital Campaign.

Trinity received a donation of stock which was immediately sold in accordance with the wishes of the donor. We need a policy so we will be confident on how to deal with future gifts of stock.

Finance approved having fund raisers to raise money for the Membership Development speakers, to pay an honorarium and travel expenses. We will need \$1500 for the next two scheduled events.

Mildred Dixon has volunteered to do an internal audit of our main account, and has proposed that this be done on an annual basis.

To date we have received 52 Estimate of Giving Cards totaling \$237,526 for our 2019 pledge campaign, "Just One Step." Our goal was 60 units. This has enabled us to increase the 2019 budget a bit. If you have not made that step, you can still do so, see Rev. Nancy or the church office.
