Church Life

5 Minute Yoga

- Let's begin by standing beside your chair. Plant your feet on the floor, establishing a good foundation. Lift out of the waist to elongate your spine. Lift the crown of the head to the ceiling.
- Sweep your arms out in a T position, palms facing the floor. Take 5 breaths here. Lower your arms. Sweep the arms up again in a T position, then make small circles with your arms. Move the whole arm, not just the wrists. Go in one direction for 10 times, then change directions for another 10 circles.
- Lower the arms. Tuck the chin to the chest and slowly sweep the chin from side to side. Return to center and lift the chin.
- Come to the back of your chair and hold onto the back. Lift up on your toes. Go up and down several times to wake up the ankles and calves.
- Still holding onto the back of the chair, keep the heels on the floor as you bend the knees. Feel the stretch in the ankles, heels, and calves. Repeat several times.
- Now come to seated. Lift your right knee up and take the leg to the right, then back to center. Repeat at least 10 times to build strength in the thigh muscle. Repeat on the left leg.
- Sit with both feet on the floor. Let's practice spinal flexes by moving the chest forward, then rounding out the back as you go backwards. Repeat several times.


Pastoral Care Team

TUMC Book Group

They have begun Phillip Yancy's What's So Amazing About Grace? Award-winning author Philip Yancey explores grace at street level. If grace is God's love for the undeserving, he asks, then what does it look like in action? And if Christians are its sole dispensers, then how are we doing at lavishing grace on a world that knows far more of cruelty and unforgiveness than it does of mercy?



Yancey sets grace in the midst of life's stark images, tests its mettle against horrific "ungrace." Can grace survive in the midst of such atrocities as the Nazi holocaust? Can it triumph over the brutality of the Ku Klux Klan? Should any grace at all be shown to the likes of Jeffrey Dahmer, who killed and cannibalized seventeen young men?

Grace does not excuse sin, says Yancey, but it treasures the sinner. True grace is shocking, scandalous. It shakes our conventions with its insistence on getting close to sinners and touching them with mercy and hope. It forgives the unfaithful spouse, the racist, the child abuser. It loves today's AIDS-ridden addict as much as the tax collector of Jesus' day. This is a wonderful, accessible book. Considering joining us on Wednesdays at IIAM in the Church Library. Trinity has a lively program for adults on Sunday mornings:

The **Koinonia Class** is carefully working their way through scripture. They meet in the classroom just outside the Fellowship Hall.

The Mary Mann Class (also meets on the 1st floor, opposite end of the Fellowship Hall) follows Cokebury's Adult Bible Study Series. This spring the series follows the theme "Discipleship and Mission." May lessons focus on "The Spread of the Gospel."

The four lessons in this unit begin with Paul's introduction of himself to the Jewish and Gentile Christians living in Rome. Paul



affirms that the call to salvation is to Israel and to Gentiles. This call to salvation is a call to a life in the Spirit and involves a new life in Christ.



Under Warren's insightful gaze, our seemingly 'boring'



daily routines become a liturgy of their own—calling us to confession and community, Scripture and Sabbath, baptism and embodiment. Some spiritual directors listen for God's invitations in our prayers....Tish confronts us with the reality that God will not be confined to 1.5 hours on a Sunday."



Church Council

Trinity Council members met Sun., Apr. 28, along with all other interested members of the congregation, for lunch, a brief business meeting and a discussion of the recent decision from the General Conference regarding human sexuality.

Trustees: Paul M. reported that all church insurance is up to date and the contract for the yard work has been finalized. \$1600 worth of much-needed maintenance has been done on the church van. The work on the air handler in the sanctuary has begun at a cost of \$2400.

Outreach: John M. gave an update on the need for volunteers for the Summer Lunch Program and provided information concerning training online and submitting for background checks. We passed around a sign-up sheet and got a few responses but still need quite a few more. A motion was approved to allow Mission and Outreach to plan a fundraiser during late summer/early fall to raise funds in support of work we hope to do on a Habitat for Humanity build.

Staff Parish: Kay C. had announced in Worship the news that Berry Temple UMC will be closing, which means that Pastor Darryl will be leaving as Trinity's Associate Pastor at the end of June. A reception will be planned to say goodbye to him and Pastor Jessica.

Finance: Cathi D. explained that Paul's company had offered to do the work on the sanctuary air handler at considerably lower cost than the next lowest bid. She made a motion that Council approve a request to move the difference between those two numbers into the JD Howell fund as partial repayment of the loan made to the Capital Improvement fund. The money will come from the general building maintenance fund. The motion was seconded and approved.

Pastor's Report: Nancy asked Council for permission to seek congregational support for the Sri Lankan pastor that works with Jessica Tripp and the Serve to Lead organization. The motion was approved. (See letter on page 10.)

After a respectful and fruitful discussion led by Dr. Allen Mullinax regarding the impacts of General Conference, the meeting was adjourned.

For a variety of reasons many WNC kids are not getting the meals they need to thrive when school is not in session. Volunteers with the Buncombe County Schools summer meals service meet this need by helping provide meals to area children at risk for seasonal hunger.

Last year Trinity helped provide meals at the Brownwood Trailer Park on North Louisiana. We have been asked to do so on the same schedule this year. We would cover 16 days, Wednesdays and Fridays beginning June 19 and ending August 9. Each day is supposed to have at least one trained "supervisor" and extra hands to help serve. The time commitment is usually less than two hours. The training for "supervisors" isn't too involved, usually you watch a video online and submit some information for a background check.

If we are to again be a part of this important program we need some new hands on deck as some who helped last year have conflicts this summer! If you would be willing to help or need more information before committing, please let John McCullough know as soon as




