Transformation Journey

TRINITY IS BEGINNING OUR OWN...



At the June 30 Church Council, we will be presented with milestones to achieve learn more about the Bishop's invitation by the team. These milestones are to the "Transformation Journey," a longer - range vision of ministry. In many ways, this is the next step of the "Dream Team" work we've already done!

The Church Transformation Journey is helping a 3 year process of discovery for local outwardly churches where they prayerfully engage stewardship practices, etc.). We will be with scripture, identify milestones that given thirty days to pray about and God is calling the church to achieve. We will also complete a self-study that provides information to the Discovery Weekend team about the history and present reality of the church.




Church Life

5 Minute Yoga

- Sit comfortably in your chair. Inhale your arms forward, exhale your arms down. Do this movement 5 more times.
- Then inhale the arms up to the ceiling (arms should be close to your ears.)
 Relax the shoulders down and away

from your ears. Exhale to lower the arms. Repeat at least 5 more times.



- With your feet firmly on the floor, knees bent, lift the right hip up, then lower. Lift the left hip up, then lower. Do this another 5 times and notice the action in your side waist.
- With your knees still bent, lift the right foot off the floor, and take the knee up as high as you can without leaning back in your chair. Hold for a breath, then release. Go to the left side now. Repeat each leg another 5 times to work your hip flexors, and increase the strength in your thighs and abdomen.
- Walk your feet wider than normal, and let your knees fall towards one another. Take 5 deep breaths and let the tension flow out of the body.
- Smile and thank God for this time of movement.


This summer, lessons focus on how Jesus fulfilled the Law in the sense that it was given full meaning. Jesus emphasized the deep, underlying messages of the gospel; and this same message is continued through the apostle Paul and the writer of Hebrews. Relationships of faith empower us to live the covenant and spread the gospel message.

A Heartfelt Covenant - The four lessons in this unit give new meaning and purpose to the Law. According to Matthew, Jesus began teaching the Law in a way that gave life to the hearer and the doer. Unlike other teachers of the Law, Jesus preached the transforming righteousness of the Kingdom. Jesus challenged the mere external observance of God's law without internal transformation.


