Trinity to Host Interfaith Music Group ABRAHAM JAM on Sun, Nov. 11!

A Muslim, a Jew, and a Christian walk into a concert hall . . . What may be mistaken for a stand-up c o m e d i a n 's opening line is



actually Abraham Jam, a trio of internationally-renowned musicians who have teamed up to create art strengthened by diversity.

Abraham Jam -- composed of Billy Jonas, David LaMotte, and Dawud Wharnsby -- features three "brothers" from the three Abrahamic faiths. Jonas and LaMotte both call Western North Carolina home, and Wharnsby lives in Kitchener, Ontario. The three have performed extensively over the last few decades in their individual careers. As Abraham Jam, they are releasing their first album, a live recording taken from a concert in Asheville last summer. This will be quickly followed by a studio album, which they are already working on in the recording studio.

Since their first concert at Duke University, Abraham

Jam has performed for the Festival of the Sacred Arts in Michigan, and for the 2016 Parliament of World Religions in Utah, among other events and venues.

Church Life

Yoga

As fall approaches, it is tempting to let our exercises take a back seat to other activities. But, please keep up the good work by doing this 5 minute chair routine. You'll be glad you did!

Before you begin, please get a strap.

- Sit tall in your chair. Relax your shoulders by taking them down and away from your ears. Gently perform 5 shoulder rolls by taking the shoulders forward, up, and back. Then go in the opposite direction by taking the shoulders up towards the ears, back, and down.
- 2. Sitting tall, and making sure your chin is tucked, gently tilt your chin toward your chest. Take two breaths, then sweep the chin from shoulder to shoulder. Do this for 30 seconds.
- Finally, with head erect and chin tucked, tilt the right ear towards your right shoulder. Breathe here, then change to the other side. This will stretch the sides of your neck.
- 4. Relax your arms and move your fingers in finger rolls. Then open and close your hands. You will make a loose fist, then extend your fingers wide. Repeat this movement at least 5 times.
- 5. Sit up in the chair. Take the strap around the right foot. Extend your right leg straight in front of you, taking the heel off the floor. Pull the toes/ball of your foot toward the body to get a nice stretch to your calf, and you will also engage your thigh muscle. Repeat this 5 times, then switch legs.
- 6. Let's perform seated crunches. Sit tall and take your arms overhead with an inhalation. Exhale and raise your right knee as you pull your elbows toward the knee. Inhale extend the arms and lower the leg. Repeat at least 5 times, then switch sides. Enjoy increasing your core body strength.
- 7. Either stand beside your chair, or continue sitting. March in place for at least one minute.
- 8. Let's finish be sitting comfortably in your chair. Take 5 deep breaths, counting to 5 on the inhalation and counting to 5 on the exhalation.
- 9. Close your eyes and turn the corners of your mouth up. Feel how that adjustment makes you feel better. Let us give thanks to the Lord for this day.





Dream Team

Trinity DREAM TEAM met Sun., Sep. 23, and continued their conversation and appreciative inquiry model as we seek to help shape future ministry to our community through our church family. At this session, we got down to some dreaming of what would it look like to live more into Trinity's strengths we'd named back in July.

Here's a compilation of what our group of about 15 sees where Trinity could live and lean in more to God's movement and blessing in our midst:

- Caring for one another, especially our homebound and elders. This might look like:
 - ♦ Starting the "next generation" of YAH a ministry of regular fellowship
 - Figuring out the best new technology to take worship to those unable to attend
 - Reimagining a Visitation/ Pastoral Care Team of laity to help with visiting our homebound or those convalescing in skilled nursing facilities
- Building upon our genuine welcome & hospitality that they experience once inside to go out and invite others within the community to come inside and experience the genuine welcome! This might look like:
 - Doing a better job through many means to share our particular story that which makes Trinity TRINITY to share the nuances of who we are (and not trying to be another church).
 - ♦ Using social media more to communicate our story & invitation
 - Using our LOCATION and BUILDING to offer more face-to-face connection with community to:
 - Offering TUMC as a spiritual hub for folks to seek out spiritual help/ counsel, Inviting nearby agencies and half-way houses to "Open Hours" in the sanctuary for prayer and quiet time (with pastors and lay folks available to pray with them if requested)
 - Hosting:
 - Repair Cafes (for small appliances, bicycles, cars - would need to connect with technical resources for help)
 - Homework Diner/ Cafe for kids and parenting support simultaneously

- Inviting other community organizations into Partnerships with us to help host some of the above ideas (realizing we have the gifts of space and location and other partners may have the skill and \$ resources to offer such programming/ ministry)
- Using our in-house talent to draw others in e.g. musicians & lovely music!
- Using our growing children & youth programs as a means of invitation - to come be a part of a healthy, lively program!
- Using our location in the center of West Avl to be a voice in, of, and for the community/ provoking others to serve in LOVE!

World Communion Sunday

On World Communion Sunday, October 7, we will be taking up one special offering to support the 6 designated special Sunday offerings supported by the global United Methodist Church:

- Human Relations Sunday (typically the Sunday before the observance of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday) strengthens United Methodist outreach to communities in the United States and Puerto Rico, encouraging social justice and work with at-risk youth.
- UMCOR Sunday (fourth Sunday in Lent) previously known as One Great Hour of Sharing, this Sunday enables the United Methodist Committee on Relief to reach out through worldwide ministries of food, shelter, health and peace.
- Native American Ministries Sunday (third Sunday of Easter) nurtures mission with Native Americans and provides scholarships for United Methodist Native American seminarians.
- Peace with Justice Sunday (first Sunday after Pentecost) enables the UMC to have a voice in advocating for peace and justice through a broad spectrum of global programs.
- World Communion Sunday (first Sunday of October) provides scholarships for U.S. racial- and ethnic -minority students and international students, on both undergraduate and graduate levels.
- United Methodist Student Day (last Sunday of November) furnishes scholarships and loans for students

attending United Methodist-related and other accredited colleges and universities.

Our goal is at least \$600, averaging at least \$100 per designated offering. Anything over this goal of \$100 per designated offering will be given to UMCOR for Hurricane Florence Relief. If your household could offer an additional \$10-20 offering on October 7, we would more than reach our goal based on our average worship attendance.

End of Year Giving

Helpful Hints from the WNC United Methodist Foundation (WNCUMF)

As we head towards the end of the year, some of you may be considering how to provide a little extra to Trinity with an additional tax benefit. Consider how to make the most of an IRA Required Minimum Distribution:

Per the IRS, people 70½ and older are required to take a minimum distribution from their IRA or be faced with a hefty tax penalty. If you must take a required minimum distribution, but don't need the funds and don't want to pay income taxes on it, please consider gifting it to Trinity as part of your annual support.

To qualify for the tax credit, you must have your retirement plan administrator direct the distribution DIRECTLY to Trinity UMC; it cannot pass through your hands or it will trigger an income taxable event for you.
