Dream Team

In November, we addressed the "DESIGN" portion of our appreciative inquiry process, namely answering the questions:

What are we already doing to live into this vision and our strengths? What might we try? And Who do we need to invite to join us?

We began our meeting sharing stories of saints (living or passed on) whose relationship with God was so vibrant that it strengthened our own faith. Then we got to work and began to focus on the above questions as they relate to our strengths. We feel God's movement for ministry focus in 2019 in two areas - Wholistic Evangelism (which we also discussed as "care" and "hospitality") and Risk-Taking Mission. This also aligns with what the Staff Parish Team and Clergy agreed upon as our two greatest potential growth areas for our church family.

Here's a sampling of the specific ideas we've dreamed could be built upon:

Wholistic Evangelism to our elders:

- Organize Visitation Team (to visit home-bound and those in care facilities);
- Survey elders to determine what is their desire for fellowship and engagement (e.g., the "next generation" of YAH, "Young at Heart")

Wholistic Evangelism to new Christians/ those desiring to know more and our surrounding community:

- Identify teachers (staff and members) to lead rotating classes (e.g., Bible, Methodism)
- Utilize building & location as tool for building relationships with new Christians & discerning faith
- Better utilize multiple media means (social media, website, West Asheville Business Association, print ads) to communicate "Our Story"/ who we are and invite relationship:
 - ◊ E.g., put "chicken pie" story on our website
 - Ask TUMC members to produce short videos about TUMC
 - Offer surveys, esp. to young families & singles about activities to join (e.g., date nights with babysitting, hiking, tubing, snow tubing, etc.)
 - Investigate Asheville "Newcomers" groups to see how we might engage with them

Risk-Taking Mission:

Utilize building & location as tool for building

relationships with those outside our "tradition" discerning faith through partnerships with like-minded groups

- Utilize building & location as tool for helping people experience God's love through having sanctuary open and staffed for prayer and reflection at regular times (perhaps in cooperation with 12 Baskets Lunch schedule and AA meetings).
- Utilize location to create a community art project, e.g., Prayer Mural Wall outdoors
- Plan an intergenerational mission trip and continue to build upon local missional engagements

We'll meet again on **Sun., Jan. 20, at 5PM** in the Library, beginning our meetings with a time of sharing, getting to know one another a little better. We honor all perspectives, believing that the Spirit moves when we come together as the Body of Christ. We are in a constant learning movement of <u>discovering</u> our strengths and <u>designing</u> ministry. All are welcome!



<u>Yoga</u>

Wake up your facial muscles with these simple movements:





- 2. Keeping your face still, just raise and lower your eyebrows about 20 times. This engages the muscles along the forehead. Pause at the end and notice the sensations.
- 3. Crinkle your nose (like you smell something unpleasant) then release. Do this at least 20 times. Feel the effects on the upper lip and sides of the nose.
- 4. Does everyone remember the show Bewitched and the character Samantha? She twitched her mouth from side to side. Let's mimic her movement, pulling your lips from side to side. Notice the stretch along the upper lip and at the chin. Do this movement about 20 times each side.
- 5. Now, open your eyes wide as you open your mouth in a big yawn, then close your eyes tightly as you close your mouth. Work the joints of the jaw and stretch the muscles on the side of your face and jaw. Open and close about 10 times.
- 6. Finally, pucker your lips, like you're going to give your honey a big kiss, then release. Do this movement at least 20 times.
- 7. Close your eyes and feel the sensations. Your face should feel alive.

Take a moment to give thanks to God for this time to take care of your body.

A Dementia Support Group, co-led by TUMC members Vernon & Joyce Robinson, will have an initial gathering on **Mon., Dec. 3, 6 PM** in the Library. The "communal urn" design is intended to be a significant beginning of the Memorial Garden in which cremains would be secure inside a hand-hewn rock design that would be locked and sealed, thereby avoiding the expense of a fence and keeping the garden area on the Martin Street side of the sanctuary open to the public for meditation.

Rev. H. Wendell Brittain (2 Apr 1931 - 16 Nov 2018)

Rev. H. Wendell Brittain, age 87 of Brank Cove Road, died Friday, November 16.

Wendell was born April 2, 1931 in Buncombe County to the late Verona and Lula Cole Brittain.

Rev. Brittain received a degree in music theory and a master's in

theology. For 47 years he was involved in Methodist Ministry, pastoring 15 churches, including Associate Pastor and Education Director at Trinity UMC, and was also Minister of Music and Bell Choir Director at Salem United Methodist Church. He was versatile in playing numerous musical instruments and incorporated his talent into his ministry. A veteran of the U.S. Army; he served 17 months in Germany as a scout dog trainer.

He enjoyed oil painting, cooking, writing poetry, being outdoors, singing, composing and even produced several CD's. He sang in 35 out of 47 productions of Handels Messiah in Weaverville. Christmas was his favorite time of year and he always made it special for his family.

Surviving are his daughters, Wendy Spainhour and husband Todd and Cara Furr; brother, Rev. Dr. Robert Brittain and wife Lurline Cope Brittain; grandchildren, Crystal Moor and husband Mitchel, Dillon Furr, and Madeline, Natalie and Eleanor "Elle" Spainhour; great grandson, Caius Moor.

His funeral service was held at 11 AM Tue., Nov. 27 in Salem United Methodist Church. Rev. Kent Smith and Rev. Dr. Tim Brittain officiated. Burial followed in Clark's Chapel Cemetery.



End of Year Giving

Helpful Hints from the WNC United Methodist Foundation (WNCUMF)

As we head towards the end of the year, some of you may be considering how to provide a little extra to Trinity with an additional tax benefit. Consider how to make the most of an IRA Required Minimum Distribution:

Per the IRS, people 70¹/₂ and older are required to take a minimum distribution from their IRA or be faced with a hefty tax penalty. If you must take a required minimum distribution, but don't need the funds and don't want to pay income taxes on it, please consider gifting it to Trinity as part of your annual support.

To qualify for the tax credit, you must have your retirement plan administrator direct the distribution DIRECTLY to Trinity UMC; it cannot pass through your hands or it will trigger an income taxable event for you.


