WHAT TO DO WHEN...

You want to help an individual:

- Get to know the person living in your area and treat them in a way that builds respect between you as good neighbors. A little respect can go a long way.
- Offer to connect them to services. Call NC 2-1-1, a free, 24/7 resource that connects people to community, health, and disaster services. See the resources section for organizations directly serving unhoused persons.
- Encourage them to seek additional services and support. Call Homeward Bound's Outreach Team: 828-768-3435.

You want to take community action:

- When you want to get more involved, you can connect to one of the many organizations that directly help homeless people, try to end homelessness, or work to increase affordable housing.
- One of the best things you can do as a business is to find one organization that you want to support and ask them what they need.
- Asheville's service providers know how to help our homeless population; it's what they're best at. The more we support them, the more they can help people get off the streets and find pathways out of homelessness.
- Housing is an effective and long-term solution for homelessness, but it takes partnerships from private landlords willing to work with housing programs. Talk with landlords you know and encourage them to learn how they can participate in housing programs by calling the Community and Economic Development Department at 828-232-4505.

How to Encourage a Positive Environment

Do's

- Keep the area around your store clean and well maintained. If you keep your area clean, others are more likely to respect it.
- Get to know your Homelessness Outreach Worker and APD Community Engagement Officer. Talk to them about the problems you're having with homeless individuals.
- If someone, homeless or not, is being disruptive, try to deescalate the situation if you are comfortable doing so. A few reasonable words may prevent the police or others from having to get involved and reduce the criminalization of homelessness.
- If homeless people are loitering around your business and won't leave, call the homelessness outreach staff: 828-768-3435 or the non-emergency APD line: 828-252-1110. If they are unruly or violent, call 9-1-1.
- Lock or turn off exterior power outlets. (See "Shelters & Libraries" in the Additional Resources section for locations providing power outlets.)
- Install motion-activated exterior lighting for after hours.
- File a <u>"No Trespass" form</u>, so the APD can enforce the law on your property after hours when you're not there. Call the APD non-emergency line 828-252-1110.
- Know local service providers who can provide a meal or shower in your neighborhood so you can point people in the right direction.
- If you have an ongoing community concern about homelessness needing attention, email: helpendhomelessness@ashevillenc.gov
- Download the <u>Asheville App</u> and the <u>P2C Tool</u> to report nonemergency problems to the City or APD. See a problem? Take a photo, upload it, and a report is generated.

Dont's

- Don't offer food or money. It often encourages panhandling. Call NC 2-1-1 so you'll know the social service organizations nearest your business equipped to help and provide more comprehensive services beyond a meal.
- Don't permit anyone to camp on your property, unless you have developed a trusting relationship with them.
- Don't allow anyone to store shopping carts or personal belongings on your property.
