

As some of you know, in the cleaning of the church, a quilt coverlet was found that was made in 1929 by the women's circles of Balm Grove Methodist Episcopal Church (now Trinity United Methodist Church). It contains over 250 names of members embroidered on the coverlet. The guilts was made based on a pattern known as the World War I quilt. These quilts were made to raise money to help returning veterans. A person paid to have his or her name on the guilt. The women of the church used this idea and other ways to raise money to save the church. Just after the church was built, the debt was around \$150,000. The great Depression of 1929 threatened to cause sale of the church. Somehow the people managed to raise the money to keep the church by also selling bricks and homemade chicken pies.

The quilt had been in the possession of a former pastor's family. In the summer of June 2005, the family gave back the quilt to Trinity. There are multiple squares with different layouts featuring names of families in the church at that time, children baptized, and more. Several of the members met in the parlor



to look at this lovely gift. It was then packaged back up and placed in the third floor history room.

The quilt will be covered with polycarbonate and hung in the main hall of the church. When this is done, check the names. You might find one of your ancestors!

Trinity has a lot of history that many other churches do not have. These members of 90 years ago worked hard to preserve the heritage that came to them from the Miller Meeting House and formed in the 1800s and to

hand down to us the house of God that we call Trinity United Methodist.

We are truly drinking from wells we did not dig.

COVID UPDATES & REMINDERS

With the Delta Variant becoming the most dominant Coronavirus strain in the United States, The CDC and Governor Cooper have issued new guidance regarding masks, particularly for children under 12 and others who are unvaccinated.

As of July 28, 2021, the Bishop and Cabinet of the WNCCUMC are recommending the following:

Our vital churches are blessed with the presence of multiple generations, and regard for the vulnerable is crucial. Please bring your children's ministry team into your decision-making processes and protocols, in addition to your Trustees.

- I. The Bishop and Cabinet remain committed to our biblical mandate to "love our neighbors as ourselves" and our Wesleyan call to "do no harm." Ministry encompasses not only worship but also fellowship events, mission activities, study groups, and age-level gatherings. The wellbeing of our children, youth, and vulnerable populations still needs to be considered with love and care in all areas of congregational life. Please take into consideration those who cannot be vaccinated because of age and/or preexisting conditions when establishing safety guidelines for your local church.
- 2. We encourage persons to be vaccinated and respect the fact that some cannot be vaccinated because they are immunocompromised.
- 3. Due to the current rise in positive test results and hospitalizations, we encourage the wearing of masks at all indoor ministry activities, including worship.
- 4. To protect our children, we strongly recommend you consider the following in your ministries with children:
- Requiring all students, volunteers, staff, and visitors to wear a mask over their nose and mouth while on church property or engaged in off-site children's ministry activities.
- Strongly recommend that volunteers be fully vaccinated, and that churches implement symptom screening for each volunteer before the gathering.
- Try to use outdoor spaces a much as possible.
- Limit the consumption of snacks during an event and use individually packed items.

SEPTEMBER MEETING HIGHLIGHTS FINANCE

Monies placed with the WNC UMC Foundation will have 2 funds per designation, both an endowment and investment (more accessible as needed). For example, there will be a Building Endowment as well as a Building Investment Fund. Endowed funds will only have access to interest earned, thus preserving principle for the long-term. Investment accounts will allow easier access to funds while still making a better return than traditional bank and CD funds. In addition to the Building Funds, there are a Missions, Music, and General accounts.

The PPP loan received earlier in 2021 is in process of going through the "forgiveness" process. Once that is completed, it will show as an asset instead of a liability.

We are transitioning our church management software to a product called **Realm** (cloud based software) which



will allow staff to connect with congregants through their devices so we can communicate, share ministry information and volunteer opportunities (PLUS it will save the church financial resources). So over the

We are still learning how the system works and we appreciate your patience as we learn its implementation. Let us know what questions you may have! Anyone who was giving via VANCO (online giving portal) should not see a change in the service. However, VANCO always had a processing fee that the church had to consume when anyone gave through it. With Realm, the giver will be given an option to offset the gift (if they so choose) so the church gets the entire contribution.

A PART OF TRINITY'S HISTORY

Deuteronomy 6: 10-12 (When God ushers you into the land He promised through your ancestors, you will walk through cities you did not build, well-furnished houses you did not build, drink from wells you did not dig, and vineyards you did not plant. When you take it all in, don't forget how you got there.)
