Deep Time is an emerging United Methodist ministry that invites those who are impacted by incarceration into communities of worship, employment, and belonging. Rev. Dustin Mailman has invited our congregation, and the leadership of our



congregation, into a season of discernment pertaining to Trinity United Methodist Church becoming an Anchor Church for Deep Time. The function of an Anchor Church is to pray, support, and offer space for emerging congregations. At Trinity, this will mostly look like our congregation sharing physical space within the Church, and sharing the time that is expected of me week-to-week.

The myth that incarceration tells us is that “hard time,” time in prison, is rehabilitative. Deep Time believes that God invites us into rehabilitation through “deep time.” Deep Time is the phrase mystics use to describe Kairos moments: moments where a radical encounter with the living Christ makes hours seem like seconds and seconds seem like hours, creating beloved community. By leaning into the intersection of Christian Community, Social Enterprise, and Community Development, we are inviting those who are most disinherited in our community to enter into Deep Time.

The initial goal is to launch a coffee roasting social enterprise that will hire two persons who were formerly incarcerated, and additionally launching a network of Fresh Expressions Communities. Pastor Dustin is pursuing this with the blessing of the Western North Carolina Conference of the UMC, the Blue Ridge District of the WNCCUMC, and numerous other communities in Asheville.

On **Sun., Apr. 30**, there will be space made for conversation, questions, and presentation about what a potential future with Deep Time might look like with Trinity United Methodist as the anchor church. The hope for this time is that we can faithfully wrestle, dream, and pray for what our future may look like. Grace and Gratitude, Pastor Dustin.

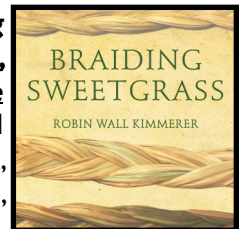

A LETTER FROM OUR BOARD & FINANCE CHAIRS & PASTOR

Dear Trinity UMC

Family & Friends,

One year ago, in Apr. 2022 the Trinity Leadership Council engaged in conversations with Mark King, the Conference Treasurer/Director of Administrative Services for the Western North Carolina Conference, seeking his guidance and help with reviewing Trinity's financial system. The TLC contracted with Covenant Accounting Management, LLC, a wholly owned small business set up by Mark King that specializes in church finance and accounting.


During the past year, under this contract, Mark has shared his experience and made recommendations regarding Trinity's financial policies, procedures and has provided various checklists to help with ongoing administration. In addition, he reviewed the chart of accounts in the Realm accounting system and developed monthly closing procedures in line with the system recommendations. Mark was given access to all of our current software and accounts, and he performed a complete review of our records for the past two years and completed a reconciliation and cleanup of our financial system with accounts that over the years had become spread over multiple banks and other financial institutions. Inactive accounts were closed and some accounts were combined to streamline our financial management process. Restricted funds were moved from simple savings or money market accounts at local banks and credit unions over to individual investment accounts at the United Methodist Foundation of Western North Carolina.

Last month we completed the cleanup and reconciliation of all accounts and have mapped all restricted and non-restricted accounts to ensure that our books are balanced. This activity required us to transfer funds between some accounts to reflect, for example payments that in the past were made from our General Fund that should have been paid from some of the restricted funds. Available at the church on the table by the elevator or in the Narthex, you will find the Year End 2022 Statement of Activities and Financial Positions Summary. We are still finalizing our 2023 Budget (discussed and pending approval at the Apr. TLC meeting) but we expect to see a deficit of approximately -\$40,000 as compared to the -\$43,000 deficit we experienced last year. While the TLC and staff already try to avoid using the full amount of all budgeted items, a deficit in 2023 will mean that we are not able to fully fund many items such as VBS, our Upper Room subscription, youth events, curriculum, lawn maintenance, cleaning services, and our Nursery. Your continued faithful giving makes it possible for us to continue in ministry alongside you and our community. Please let us know if you have any questions.

STRATEGIC PLANNING UPDATE

Our Strategic Planning Team met **Sat., Feb. 25, and Sat., Mar. 18**. During these sessions, we clarified our strategy for the remainder of 2023.

As we continue to finalize our Strategic Plan for 2023, we need to make sure there is agreement on the wording we will use to communicate our Vision, Values, Mission, and Objectives. These statements talk about who we are, how we behave and what we will be doing.

Some of these statements and ideas have evolved from previous statements used by Trinity, while other statements are new ideas stemming from the Strategic Planning team discussions.

The Vision statement has been around for several years, but it is being amended to add, "as disciples of Jesus Christ, where actions speak louder than words." The Values statement was created about one year ago, and it is being amended to include the word "respectful".

As one of our team members noted, "inclusion of 'actions speak louder than words' and 'respectful' make it more powerful and descriptive of the way we try to live as Christians, and what we expect in our dealings with others."

Trinity's Mission recognizes a responsibility to provide a comprehensive program in support of ministries for the Nurture, Outreach, Worship, and Stewardship of Resources as interpreted from the United Methodist Book of Disciplines ¶ 244. These four pillars serve as the catalyst for implementing our plans. Nurture: Caring for and engaging with our church family; Outreach: Providing compassionate service to local, regional, and global communities; Worship: Developing, strengthening and sharing our Christian experience and faith; and Stewardship: Ensuring the health and sustainability of our church resources (people, building, finances).

And finally, the Objectives are intended as guard rails to help keep us on track and guide us in our decision making when we review and approve action plans, programs, and initiatives in the coming year. These objectives are to focus on Church Growth; Connecting; Worship Experiences; and Serving.

Please let your leadership team know if there are any questions or concerns about any of these statements. We hope to start communicating these ideas more widely in the near future.

WNCCUMC FROM BISHOP CARTER

Bishop Carter Announces a Virtual Special Session of the Western North Carolina Annual Conference

In accordance with Paragraph 603.5 of the 2016 Book of Discipline and Rule 32 of the WNCC Rules of Order, Bishop Ken Carter is calling a Special Executive Session of Clergy Members at 9:00am and a Special Session of the Western North Carolina Annual Conference at **10AM**, to be held on **Sat., May 6, 2023**. Both meetings will be held virtually.

The sole purpose of the called executive session of clergy members is to vote on clergy withdrawals. The sole purpose of the called session is to vote on the WNC Conference Board of Trustees' recommendations for churches choosing to disaffiliate from The United Methodist Church through the authorized process outlined in Paragraph 2553.



Business will include Delegate Voting: At the 2023 WNC Annual Conference meeting, there will be lay delegate elections for the General Conference and Jurisdictional Conference meetings scheduled in 2024. Laity will elect 2 or 3 lay delegates, as well as 3 reserve delegates, to fill openings that occurred because of lay member resignations since 2019 when the original elections took place.

LAKE JUNALUSKA ANNUAL PLANT SALE

The Lake Junaluska Annual Plant Sale and the Corneille Bryan Native Garden plant sale will be held together on **Sat., May 6**, from **8 AM to 2 PM** at the open-air Nanci Weldon Memorial Gym.

Plants range in price from \$2 to \$35 and can be purchased by cash, check, or charge. Proceeds from the plant sale directly support landscaping at Lake Junaluska, where the grounds and gardens are open for all to enjoy and made possible through charitable giving.

Also at the sale will be several varieties of plants from the Corneille Bryan Native Garden. Proceeds from the sale of native plants will specifically benefit the Corneille Bryan Native Garden.

She could recognize and recall their faces, names, and family members years later. She exemplified the best of professionalism, dedication, compassion, and commitment. She was a mentor to many new teachers at the school and tried to inspire them to be their best selves.

Jennie was a lifelong member of Trinity United Methodist Church in West Asheville and was actively involved in many aspects of the church life through the years. 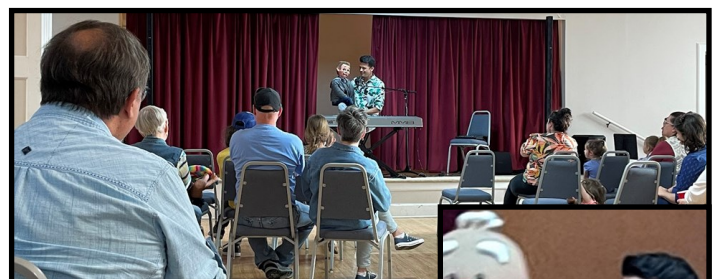
