

Ties are a suggested \$5 donation and may be purchased (and decorated) before and after worship.



(arms should be close to your ears.) Relax the shoulders down and away

from your ears. Exhale to lower the arms. Repeat at least 5 more times.

- Now, move forward in your chair and bend the right arm behind your back. See if you can rest the back of your right hand on your lower back, or maybe, at your left hip. Take 3 deep breaths here. Release that arm and repeat with the left arm. Repeat this 5 more times.
- With your feet firmly on the floor, knees bent, lift the • right hip up, then lower. Lift the left hip up, then lower. Do this another 5 times and notice the action in your side waist.
- With your knees still bent, lift the right foot off the floor, and take the knee up as high as you can without leaning back in your chair. Hold for a breath, then release. Go to the left side now. Repeat each leg another 5 times to work your hip flexors, and increase the strength in your thighs and abdomen.
- Walk your feet wider than normal, and let your knees fall towards one another. Take 5 deep breaths and let the tension flow out of the body.
- Smile and thank God for this time of movement. Andrea Davis and Mildred Dixon offer a gentle yoga class each Thursday evening from 6 to 7 PM Props are available. We would love to see you this week.

Christian Formation on Sundays

Trinity has a lively program for adults on Sunday mornings:

The **Koinonia Class**: The central thought of Ephesians us the realization of disunity in the world that will only become unity when everything is united in Jesus Christ. They meet in the



classroom just outside the Fellowship Hall.

The Mary Mann Class (also meets on the 1st floor, opposite end of the Fellowship Hall) follows Cokebury's Adult Bible Study Series. The Summer Theme is A Covenant in Christ Jesus.


This summer, lessons focus on how Jesus fulfilled the Law in the sense that it was given full meaning. Jesus emphasized the deep, underlying messages of the gospel; and this same message is

continued through the apostle Paul and the writer of Hebrews. Relationships of faith empower us to live the covenant and spread the gospel message.

A Fulfilled Covenant - The first unit, in four lessons, reveals a new sign of the covenant for Jewish and Gentile believers, as recorded in Matthew, Mark, Luke, Hebrews, and Colossians. During the celebration of the Passover, Jesus explained to the disciples that he would initiate a new covenant through his death. Paul explains that the sign of the covenant is now a relationship of the heart between God and God's people, not circumcision.

The Faith Sunday School Class is having shared conversation and lively dialogue with The Rev. Tish Warren's <u>Liturgy of the</u> <u>Ordinary: Sacred Practices in</u> <u>Everyday Life</u>. Here's what one reviewer has to say: "Sunday liturgy shapes our faith through its mix of prayers, songs, Scriptures, and sermons. We hear from and



are shaped by God through these practices. Under Warren's insightful gaze, our seemingly 'boring' daily routines become a liturgy of their own—calling us to confession and community, Scripture and Sabbath, baptism and embodiment. Some spiritual directors listen for God's invitations in our prayers. Tish confronts us with the reality that God will not be confined

5th Sunday Gathering ~ June 30 ~ 10 AM

June 30 - 5th Sunday Gathering

Church Council is hosting this meeting for Council and the TUMC family to learn more about the Bishop's invitation to the "Transformation Journey."



You may recall that about this time

last year, Trinity was chosen as a "Good to Great" Church for the WNC Annual Conference. Through this program, we have been able to participate in an national survey of our Trinity's economic impact in Asheville and receive the services of the Joyful Giving Group Stewardship Program. As a part of this designation of a "good to great" church, we have been invited to consider participation on the "Transformation Journey."

The Church Transformation Journey is a three-year process of discovery for local churches where they will prayerfully engage with scripture, identify milestones that God is calling the church to achieve to fulfill God's vision for the church, and then partner with a Navigator and Guides, to embark on a journey of living into God's calling for their church and their role in transforming the world.

Churches identify their milestones through hosting a Discovery Weekend where a Discovery Weekend Team made up of experienced clergy and laypersons will help the church name up to five challenge areas they want to emphasize. If these milestones are approved by the church, a Navigator and Guides will be assigned to work closely with their pastor/s and church leaders over the next three years to implement their Transformation Journey initiatives.

To prepare for a Discovery Weekend, the church names a team of church leaders who are willing to spend thirty days in preparation for the Discovery Weekend by studying scripture and praying for their church and community and for the Discovery Weekend. Churches also complete a self-study that provides information to the Discovery Weekend team about the history and present reality of the church.

After the Discovery Weekend, a church is presented with milestones to achieve. These milestones are recommendations that surface during the Discovery Weekend and could be anything related to church health (e.g., creating a stronger discipleship pathway, helping the church become more outwardly focused, creating good stewardship practices, etc.). The church is given thirty days to pray about and consider these milestones and then holds a church conference to accept the milestones. If the 70% of the church or more agrees to proceed, the Discovery Weekend Facilitator and pastor will create a projected roadmap for the rest of the journey. A Navigator will be assigned and will then assist the church by coordinating guides and teams to complete their journey.

Vernon & Joyce Robinson, Phillip Gibson and Rev. Nancy attended a March 23 luncheon sponsored by the Bishop in Charlotte to learn more. They will offer a short presentation on **Sun., Jun. 30, 10AM** for our **5th Sunday Fellowship**. Please come and learn in order to voice your thoughts on our participation.

All are invited and encouraged to attend the Sunday morning gathering.

We would cover 16 days, Wednesdays and Fridays beginning June 19 and ending August 9. Each day is supposed to have at least one trained "supervisor" and extra hands to help serve. The time commitment is usually less than two hours. The training for "supervisors" isn't too involved, usually you watch a video online and submit some information for a background check.




Estimated Physical Demands: Participants should be able to walk short to medium distances and get into and out of a regular bus and/or van. No major stairways are expected.
