2019 General Conference

A special session of our denomination's largest body, the worldwide General Conference, convenes **February 23-26, 2019** in St. Louis, Missouri. The purpose will be to receive and act on a report from the *Commission on a Way Forward* based on the recommendations of the Council of Bishops. The 32-member Commission was authorized by General Conference 2016 and appointed by the Council of Bishops to examine paragraphs in The Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality and exploring options to strengthen the unity of the church.



Memorial Garden

Memorial Garden

The Trustees are moving forward with a Memorial Garden that will contain a communal space for the final resting place of ashes of loved ones. Below is a custom design that has been submitted to the Trustees which they have viewed and are considering at recommendation of the Trustees ad hoc committee overseeing the Memorial The "communal Garden. urn" design is intended to be a significant beginning of the Memorial Garden in which cremains would be secure inside a hand-hewn rock design that would be locked and sealed, thereby avoiding the expense of a fence and keeping the garden area on the Martin Street side of the

This is a revised design for a communal urn. Though similar in form to the first design, there are some significant changes to the piece.

The base has been removed, so that the sides continue down into the ground without any change to the

The cap is a single piece of stone, that is flat and allows for a sculptural piece- a cross created by a member of the congregation.

Not shown in these sketches: the concrete footing that supports the piece will be a donut- open in the middle. This allows for the ashes to make contact with the Earth.

Midway up the main body of the urn there is a single piece of stone that is inscribed with a quote or verse that speaks to the cycle of life and the passage from one place into the next. I consulted with the engravers I like to work with; they expect that we would be able to fit about 97 letters on the perimeter of that stone. That should serve as a general guide to choosing a phrase or quote. I would be inclined to err on the lower side of that number as you search for a suitable

Church Life

5 Minute Yoga

- First, let's release the tension in our neck and shoulders.
- Sit tall in your chair with your soles of the feet on the floor. Inhale and take the shoulders towards the ears, then exhale and release the shoulders. Repeat 5 or more times.



- Bend your arms at the elbows, like goal posts. Now, sweep the bent arms forward, touching the elbows and forearms and releasing tension in the shoulder blades and upper back. Return to the starting position. Repeat this move at least 10 times, remembering to inhale and exhale with the movement.
- Reach your arms overhead, extending the arms as straight as you can. Reach, reach, reach for the ceiling, then release the arms, hands on your lap. Repeat 5 more times. Breathe during the movements.
- Sit up straight and tall, and look forward. Drop your chin toward the chest. Take 5 breaths. Then sweep the chin from shoulder to shoulder several times. Return to center and take the chin so it is parallel to the floor. Now turn your head to the right, looking over your right shoulder. Breathe here. Then turn your head to your left and take several breaths. Return to center.
- Finally, do shoulder rolls, taking both shoulders up, back, and around. Then reverse the direction.
- Smile and notice the increased circulation in the neck and shoulders.

Worship Notes

From now until Lent, we'll actually be following the **Sunday Morning Van Drivers** lectionary one week behind the assigned dates. We'll talk about what it means to "Be Church," to put our gifts and talents to work, individually and as a whole and how our individual and collective stories work together for the good of the Gospel (Feb. 3); how those "outside" the Church also weave their stories into the Gospel, sometimes with our encouragement, and sometimes in spite of us (Feb. 10); how God uses the ordinary and everyday to get our attention and call us to proclaim Good News (Feb 17); and how that Good News must include not only Good Friday but Resurrection, even in the midst of suffering. Finally, on the last Sunday of Epiphany we'll celebrate Jesus' transfiguration, break bread together, and hear God's reminder that Jesus is the Beloved who shows us how to be Beloved together.

Adult Sunday Schools

Christian Formation on Sundays:

Trinity has a lively program for adults on Sunday mornings:

The Koinonia Class is carefully working their way through scripture. In February, they'll be studying the Book of Ephesians with a focus on the early church and how it applies today.

The Sprinkle-Bagwell and Mary Mann Classes will be following Cokebury's Adult Bible Study Series. The last unit of the winter series concludes with passages from three of the Psalms expressing glorification of God. Psalm 48 focuses on a song of adoration for God's steadfast love; Psalm 66 focuses on part of a love song of praise to God for all God's mighty works of goodness; and Psalm 91 closes this unit with a praise song to God for assurance of protection and comfort for those who love God.

The Faith Class began a new book in January, Nouwen's The Return of the Prodigal Son. In seizing the inspiration that came to him through his encounter of Rembrandt's depiction of the powerful Gospel story, Henri Nouwen probes the several movements of the parable: the younger son's return, the father's restoration of sonship, the elder son's vengefulness, and the father's compassion. In his reflection on Rembrandt in light of his own life journey, the author evokes a powerful drama of the parable in a rich, captivating way that is sure to reverberate in the hearts of readers. The themes of homecoming, affirmation, and reconciliation will be newly discovered by all who have known loneliness, dejection, jealousy, or anger. We'll be continuing in this book during February:

Window Unit AC's for sale

Since the new HVAC installs, we have about 5 window units that are available! All we ask is a donation back to the Capital Campaign fund to help pay off that debt. Please see Darryl Parker.

Duke Energy LED Light Grant Received -**Fixtures Installed in Education Building**

In mid-January, all three floors of our Education Building received either new LED fixtures or bulbs in existing fixtures! This was thanks to the support of the local Creation Care Alliance (a network of people of faith and congregations who have united around a moral and spiritual call to preserve the integrity, beauty and health of God's creation). They helped TUMC receive an energy audit and get us involved as one of a handful of local faith communities participating in the first "Congregational Light Renewal Pilot Project" Data from the Energy Savings Analysis helped us receive for a grant to offset the costs of upgrading all the light fixtures to LED fixtures (inside and out) for our Education Building (the building that has the highest usage on a weekly basis). This is also made possible through Duke Energy's grants with the Small Business Energy Saver Program that they are expanding to non-profits. These upgrades will result in ~\$140 savings each month. We will pay \$1460 of the more than \$9000 for the upgrades, and we return in monthly savings on that investment will be taken care of in less than a year. Trinity is one of the first churches in Asheville to receive this grant and help

The Ministry of Generosity

We are pleased that we ended 2018 with less debt that in the previous 5 years, thanks to extra end of year giving and folks completing their pledges. THANK YOU!

Over 30 people had a great meeting on January 27 with the Rev. A.J. Thomas of the Joyful Giving Group who's led our Generosity course. Based off of this work, the Finance Team's goals for 2019 include some of what A.J. shared:

- Let the mission drive the mission. Often, other things are driving: budget/money, facilities, programs, personalities, peripheral issues. You can tell what other issues are driving by what is named as the reason we can't do something.
 - ♦ Build a winning program (changing hearts and lives in the congregation, community, world)
 - ♦ Tell good stories of the congregation in mission (elements of a good ministry story included)
 - ♦ Focus on strengths, positives, and wins in the narrative (think of the meeting after the meeting)
 - ♦ Remember that money follows mission. People give where they see lives being changed
- Continue to follow the "step up" program of asking ourselves to consider taking "just one step," even if that is a small percentage or fraction of a percentage. He gave the following example:
 - ♦ Take a step in that direction by increasing 1% relative to income
 - ♦ For the average person in our church's zip code, that equates to \$6 per person per week, \$312 per person per year, and possibly \$39,000 across the entire congregation in a year's time. Imagine if we just did \$3/ person per week? We'd most likely end the year in a surplus to begin a longed-for ministry or offer greater, deeper support for current ministry!

- Clarify, focus, and articulate the mission. Some questions to ask in this process:
 - ♦ Why do people need this particular church?
 - ♦ What does/can our church offer that is distinct from other churches?
 - Oheart tugged to meet the needs of people around our church?
 - What's something unique about our church you're really proud of?
 - Oheo How do our distinctives and uniqueness lend to meeting the needs of the people in our community?
 - Though no church can do everything, each church can do a few things well. What are one or two areas where the church could focus its mission (activities, donations, volunteers, etc.) in order to have a deeper impact?
 - Are there some mission activities we might need to let go of in order to focus deeper (quality vs. quantity)?

Capital Campaign
