DID YOU KNOW?

Buncombe County is in need of Poll Workers.

There are two kinds of poll workers for every election - Early voting and Election Day workers.

During Early Voting each location is staffed with a Captain and a team of workers. Captains make \$14/hr and workers make \$12/hr. Working during Early Voting requires a minimum commitment of 17 days, including weekends, in shifts plus mandatory training. The Captain carries the most responsibility; duties include voting location access, site setup/take down, task delegation, reconciliation, equipment troubleshooting, and voting process/election law familiarity. All trainings are paid.

Notice: Election Day Payment is a flat rate amount which includes payment for training.

Election Day polling places (precincts) are staffed with a Chief Judge, two Party Judges and a number of assistants. Pay is a flat rate of \$300 for Chief Judge, \$225 for Party Judge and \$200 for assistants. This is a one day

commitment with mandatory training and a site visit. All workers must be at their precinct from 6:00 a.m. until after the polls close at 7:30 p.m. and the site is taken down. Ability to use a computer is required. The Chief Judge is responsible for managing the site including voting location access, site setup/take down, task delegation, reconciliation, equipment troubleshooting, and voting process/election law familiarity.

Through the Student Assistant Program students who will be at least 17 years old by Election Day can work as Election Day assistants. Use the Student Election Assistant Application to apply.

REV. DUSTIN'S COMMUNITY INVOLVMENT

Trinity Family! My prayer is that this summer season has been one of restoration and hope. As I have transitioned into the Associate Pastor position at Trinity, SPRC has invited me to offer the ways in which I participate in missional engagement of the community. Here are some of the ways in which I am currently serving. My participation in these missional spaces is deeply connected to a sense of evangelism and connection on behalf of Trinity.

Rules Committee for the Western North Carolina Conference of the UMC: I am a voting member of this committee. The purpose of this committee is establishing the rules and operations of WNCCUMC's annual

conference.

Appalachian Wesley Foundation: I am member of their board, specifically focusing on bridging the gap between students transitioning from college life and integrating them into life in the church. Since joining in May I have already connected to 10+ young adults who are discerning worshipping at Trinity, in addition to other United Methodist Church's throughout the state

Operation Gateway: I am a member of their board, assisting in integrating those who are re-entering from prison back into day-to-day life. Through this membership I have been able to deepen community relationships and connect persons transitioning from incarceration in directions of healing, wholeness, and community.

Homeless Initiative Advisory Committee: As a member of this committee, I work alongside the City of Asheville to discern and implement resources in our community for those who are experiencing homelessness. Through this Committee I have been able to offer the tangible needs of those in our community who are without shelter and pursue funding endeavors to meet this need.

Haywood Street Congregation: Each Wednesday I offer pastoral presence amongst the community of Haywood Street Congregation, specifically amongst those who previously stayed with us in our Winter Shelter. I also occasionally offer leadership in their Wednesday worship service.

Fearless Dialogues: I have been hired as an Animator for Fearless Dialogues, which essentially means I facilitate conversations about taboo conversations amongst unlikely partners. This group meets with Fortune 500 companies, gang members, the NBA, and a variety of other partners, and discern how to form community despite differences. This is a ministry that is led by one of my seminary professors, Gregory Ellison.

Blue Ridge District Missional Engagement: I am a part of a collaborative group of pastors throughout our district that explores and implements innovative missional practices in our local churches. This is directly connected to the conference office and is an opportunity for our denomination to foster deeper connections with our neighbors.

TRINITY LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

TLC HIGHLIGHTS

 TLC will continue working with the Rev. Mark King and Covenant Accounting Management to assist with streamlining our financial chart of accounts and procedure, finish reviews of our reconciliations and define best practices along with checklists and procedures.

- We have new renters in the Parsonage! Funds secured through rent are eligible to be utilized for Parsonage expenses as well as clergy Housing Allowance per the Book of Discipline. That is currently being utilized to fund the Sr. Pastor's Housing Allowance.
- The new lease with Avl Peak Academy has been finalized, to begin July I, with rental of the 3rd floor. They are settling into that space and begin classes on Aug. 29! STRATEGIC PLANNING RETREAT UPDATES

On IOAM Sat., Jul. 23, Trinity leaders met to reflect, review, celebrate and discern our next areas of intentional focus for ministry. We reminded one another this would be a brave space with "no tongue biting," no holding back and speaking truth in love. It was invaluable to give praise to what had gone well and discern some missed marks.

The first part of the morning was centered around reviewing where we have come from, how we did with our mission to focus on family ministries in the first 6 months of 2022. We reviewed our organization clarity of:

- I) Why do we exist? To share the love of God, now and forever.
- How do we behave? We will be team members, who are generous and brave.
 And
- 3) What do we do? We build community by providing brave spaces and opportunities to gather, engage and serve.

We remembered and reflected how/ who/ where we've seen TUMC acting as generous and brave team members, creating brave spaces to gather, engage & serve thus far in 2022:

- The fall 2021 "House Cleaning" and reorganization was a huge success and catalyst that helped us along our path for success in the first half of 2022.
- The hiring of Dustin Mailman is a huge win! Grateful for his ministry amongst us!
- VBS incredible experience and success! The time, patience, love, and organization were key examples of being team members who are generous and brave.
- The fixing of "things" around the church building that is now being more utilized coming out of COVID has relied upon generous team members, brave enough to try and lend a hand to get things in good working order or arranging for professionals to fix what is beyond our scope. All this has helped return our building to a safe space to be!
- Youth Mission Trip! Another incredible experience and success meeting our goal to focus on family/ youth ministries.
- The reorganization of a Visitation Team! Office Volunteers!
- A willingness of leadership and members to not be stuck in the past and extend our space to the new school, the winter shelter.
- The decision-making process of the TLC to keep this vision in front of us, to risk trying new things and not tied solely to tradition.
- Participating in the Emma UMC Food distribution.
- We noted we are using our buildings well. In addition to the current non-profit office spaces, the Avl Peak Academy School, we are hosting rental space temporarily for the Avl Music School and their joyful noises have been a delight!
- 4) We also reflected on where we have missed some opportunities to gather, engage and serve well:

We named where we believe we could do better.

- Communications
- Expectations around re-engagement and use of the building by community
- Being more invitational in our outreach to West Avl Following lunch, we workshopped Fall Calendar dates to include:
- Trinity Tables to be the 2nd Wednesdays and Last Sundays of each month. We will look into catering possibilities as well as continuing potlucks.
- TLC will hear from a collective community effort of re-engaging the Room in the Inn model on Aug. 23, as the TLC discerns the possibility of offering winter shelter again.
- Aug. 28 is our Back / Bach to School Sunday.
- September will include presentation of bibles to rising 3rd graders, a re-engaged Bible Study on the weekdays or during Sunday School, and a return of the Book Group, and a small music ensemble / choir

- hopefully offering something once a month.
- October will include World Communion Sunday special music ensemble & Blessing of the Animals (Sept 2), Fall Festival (Sat., Oct 29) and Children's Sabbath / 5th Sunday Celebration (Oct. 30)
- All Saints Sunday & music ensemble (Nov. 6)
- Advent Activities mostly TBD, Hanging of the Greens after worship big decoration (Nov. 20), celebration and symbolic hanging of greens/ Chrismons in worship (1st Sun of Advent, Nov. 27), Outside Tree Lighting & Advent Wreath making over special Trinity Table supper (Dec 4), Stan Kenton Concert (Dec 16, 7PM), Children & Youth play sometime in December instead of slated Trinity Tables.

The final part of our retreat had us ask ourselves, **What is most important now?** We named some "big brushstrokes" of where we believe God is calling us to place our prayers, presence, gifts, service & witness for the next 6-9 months.

Keeping in mind, we will continue with seasonal programmatic objectives that will need our attention, including the Fall Festival, Children's Sabbath (Oct 30), Charge Conference & discerning Leadership for 2023-2025, our 175th Anniversary Year celebrations for 2023, Advent/ Christmas, and balancing with on-going COVID concerns. Beyond this, what is most important?

- We came up with 4 main areas:
- 1) Communication (calendar, better utilizing webpage, possibly having tastefully done screens in the Sanctuary, logistics of coordinating communication efforts across many platforms)
- 2) Technology (working on webpage, updating phone system, finding best technology to enhance worship experience for those in person & on-line)
- Facility (improving first aid/ finding a defibrillator & training; improving building security, continuing schedule of maintenance)
- 4) Engagement (2023/ 2024 Leadership, music opportunities, mission opportunities, worship, spiritual nurturing through engagement such as Trinity Table, small groups for children, youth, & adults, Missional opportunities, and offering a Gift & Talent survey to identify folks' skills and offerings to further a regular involvement & commitment to TUMC)

During our last session, we agreed that **Engagement** was the one area we discerned God was calling **TUMC** to focus upon for the next 6-9 months. The 3 main areas of engagement we will focus upon are:

1) Music

We will measure our success by the means to gather, engage and serve, including planning the music ensembles in Sunday worship, planning a concert series (1/ quarter)

for 2023, and doing even more to draw folks to the Stan Kenton AJO concert on Dec. 16.

2) Spiritual Formation

We will measure our success by the means of participation in the Trinity Table fellowships, small group discipleship such as the combined Sunday School/ Bible study class, re-engaging Youth and children and their families through their fall activities (including the Fall Festival), and participation in our missional engagement efforts.

3) Survey the TUMC community for their Gifts & Talents

We will measure our success in their area by having folks complete a Gifts and Talents survey (called the GPS) and help them identify their gifts and talents in order to utilize those results to make a commitment of engagement through Trinity's ministry.

Finally, we would like to organize our Engagement Ministry teams around 4 areas:

- Worship (Prayer Ministry, Altar Guild, Worship Team, Music Ministry)
- Connect (Trinity Tables, Special Events, Fellowship & Hospitality ministries - Visitation Team, Card Ministry)
- Grow (Education & Discipleship, small groups all ages)
- Serve (Mission, Local Community Engagement, Leadership Team, service to Trinity's resources, buildings/ grounds)


